

## 2019 Fairfield County Profile on Substance Use-Related Indicators

## Fairfield's three (3) Determinants of Substance Use from best (1) to worst (46):

- with a <u>Social</u> ranking of 21<sup>st</sup> in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of *Child Maltreatment* (2<sup>nd</sup>), *Single-Parent Home* (43<sup>rd</sup>), *Social Associations* (11<sup>th</sup>), and *Crime Index* (35<sup>th</sup>);
- an <u>Economic</u> ranking of 34<sup>th</sup> in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of *Income Inequality* (34<sup>th</sup>), *Unemployment Rate*(45<sup>th</sup>), *Children in Poverty* (29<sup>th</sup>), and 4-year High School Graduation Rate (2<sup>nd</sup>); and finally,
- with an <u>Access to Health-Related Resources</u> determinant of substance use **ranking of 33rd** in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of *Uninsured* (21<sup>st</sup>), Food Insecurity (38<sup>th</sup>), Primary Care Physician Ratio (29<sup>th</sup>), and Mental Health Provider Ratio (31<sup>st</sup>) (2019 County-Level Profile on Substance Use Indicators).

## **Substance Use:**

- Alcohol Use ranking of 4<sup>th</sup> in the state from best (1) to worst (46) with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of Binge Drinking Among Adults (1<sup>st</sup>), Heavy Use of Alcohol Among Adults (1<sup>st</sup>), Alcohol-Involved Fatal Traffic Crashes (2<sup>nd</sup> \*Worsened by 14% compared to 2018); and Alcohol-Related Hospitalizations (13<sup>th</sup> \*Worsened by 16% compared to 2018);
- Nicotine Use ranking of 2<sup>nd</sup> in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of Current Cigarette Use Among Adults (1<sup>st</sup>), Current Smokeless Use Among Adults (1<sup>st</sup>), FDA Compliance Check Inspections of Tobacco Retailers Failed (1<sup>st</sup> \*Improved by 100% compared to 2018) and Abuse/Dependence-Related Inpatient and Emergency Hospitalization (13<sup>th</sup> \*Worsened by .7% compared to 2018);
- Opioids Use ranking of 23<sup>rd</sup> in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of EMS Naloxone Administrations (46<sup>th</sup> \*Worsened by 30% compared to 2018), Opioid Prescriptions Dispensed (24<sup>th</sup> \*Improved by 10% compared to 2018), Opioid Overdose Deaths (1<sup>st</sup> \*Improved by 100% compared to 2018) and Abuse/Dependence-Related Inpatient and Emergency Hospitalization (14<sup>th</sup> \*Improved by 7% compared to 2018);
- Infectious Disease (New Cases) ranking of 36<sup>th</sup> in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of HIV (39<sup>th</sup>), Hepatitis C (39<sup>th</sup> \*Worsened by 23% compared to 2018), Chlamydia (22<sup>nd</sup> \*Improved by 11% compared to 2018) and Gonorrhea (23<sup>rd</sup> \*Worsened by 7% compared to 2018); and
- Treatment Services (Number of People Treated in State Funded centers) ranking of 7<sup>th</sup> in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of Alcohol (3<sup>rd</sup> \*Decrease by 11% compared to 2018), Nicotine (24<sup>th</sup> \*Decrease by 8% compared to 2018), Marijuana (5<sup>th</sup> \*Decrease by 4% compared to 2018) and Opiates (4<sup>th</sup> \*Increased by 27% compared to 2018).
